Commented [WK(1]: The demographic information is specific to enrolled members under the age of 18, but then the applicant states that elders are an underserved population.

Commented [WK(2]: The applicant does not provide important information about its existing program- that OVC needs in order to assess whether the applicant has the capacity to carry out the proposed project.

Commented [WK(3]: The applicant provides some details about needs and challenges, but there is no apparent relationship between the needs and challenges identified here and the demographic information provided above.

Commented [WK(4]: By leaving this section blank, the applicant fails to provide important information OVC needs to identify potential TTA needs and assess whether the proposed project is achievable.

Commented [WK(5]: The applicant did not provide demographic data that was relevant to serving a population of elders. There is no indication here that the applicant would assist children under the age of 18, which makes the demographic data all the more confusing.

Commented [WK(6]: The selection of "Child abuse/neglect" here makes the response to "Who will be served by the project?" confusing. The connection between serving elders and victims of property crimes is also not clear.

Commented [WK(2]: The responses provide a more detailed explanation of the applicant's existing victim services program, which makes it easier for OVC to assess its capacity to add a new service to the program.

Commented [WK(3]: The applicant identifies specific needs or challenges that the applicant will use the funding to address. The needs or challenges are specific to elder abuse which links the demographic data to the needs of the applicant.

Commented [WK(4]: The applicant offers a detailed explanation about how it will address the needs and challenges, which provides information to OVC about how the applicant plans to address issues that might threaten the success of the project. This information also gives OVC information about potential project partners and shows that the applicant has recognized that it will require a collaborative effort to develop and implement a project on elder abuse, and has considered how it might improve efforts to identify victims and connect them with services.

Commented [WK(5]: The responses to "Who will be served by the project?," and "What forms of crime victimization will the project address?" are consistent, and they are also consistent with all of the other responses in this section.

Goal: We will increase the number of elder abuse victims served annually by the project from 10 to 25 during the 36-month award period to fill in a gap in services identified in our last community needs assessment.

- Objective 1: By the 2nd quarter of the first year, we will hire a new 1.0 FTE Elder Advocate
- **Objective 2:** Place quarterly advertisements in the tribal newspaper, print and distribute 1,200 program brochures in the community by the end of year 3, and participate in at least 2 quarterly community outreach events.
- **Objective 3:** Increase cross-referrals between the victim services program and the elder program and health center by training staff from all programs and creating written screening and referral protocols.
- Activities: Advertise vacancy for 1.0 FTE Elder Advocate; Interview candidates and select new hire; prepare copy for ads
 and brochures and submit for OVC review and approval; train staff of health center and elder program on identifying elder
 abuse; facilitate development of response, screening, and referral protocols and submit them for OVC approval; train staff
 from victim services program, elder program and health center on protocols.
