Victim services may include, but are not limited to, emergency assistance, case management, shelter and housing, medical and dental care, victim advocacy, transportation, childcare, legal services, and employment assistance.

Program Description

OJP seeks to increase the quality and quantity of victim services through this NOFO in the following three funding categories:

Category 1: Services to Child and Youth Victims of Crime: Awards under this category will be made to entities to serve child and youth victims of crime. Child and youth victims are persons who were age 17 or younger when the victimization took place.

Category 2: Services to Victims of Elder Abuse, Fraud, and Exploitation: Awards under this category will be made to entities to serve victims of elder fraud, abuse, and exploitation. For purposes of this NOFO, victims of elder fraud, abuse, and exploitation are persons who were age 55 or older when the victimization took place.

Category 3: Services to Other Crime Victims: Awards under this category will be made to entities to serve other victims of crimes (not child or elder victimization), excluding human trafficking.



Funding Priorities

OJP will provide priority consideration to applicants that propose projects designed to advance the goals listed below.

- (a) Directly supporting law enforcement operations (including immigration law enforcement operations);
- (b) Combatting violent crime;
- (c) Supporting services to American citizens;
- (d) Protecting American children;
- (e) Supporting American victims of trafficking and sexual assault.



Unallowable Use of Funds

The activities listed below are out of the program scope and will not be funded.

- 1. Any program or activity that, directly or indirectly, violates (or promotes or facilitates the violation of) federal immigration law (including 8 U.S.C. § 1373) or impedes or hinders the enforcement of federal immigration law—including by failing to comply with 8 U.S.C. § 1373, give access to DHS agents, or honor DHS requests and provide requested notice to DHS agents.
- 2. Any program or activity that violates any applicable Federal civil rights or nondiscrimination law. This includes violations that (1) indirectly violate the law, including by promoting or facilitating violations, or (2) unlawfully favor individuals in any race or protected group, including on a majority or minority, or privileged or unprivileged, basis, within a given area, population, or sector.

Goal: To increase the quality and quantity of victim services.

Objective: Increase the availability of victim-centered services for crime victims.





Allowable Uses of Funds

- Intake to determine eligibility for programs and services.
- Case management.
- Shelter, housing, and sustenance.
- Medical care.
- Dental care.
- Mental health treatment, emergency mental health assessments, and individual and/or group counseling
- Substance use treatment.
- Victim advocacy and information about crime victims' rights and services.
- Life skills training.
- Complex case review.

- Literacy education, job training, and/or education and GED assistance.
- Employment assistance.
- Transportation assistance.
- Childcare to facilitate the victim's participation in services.
- 24-hour response.
- Legal services.
- Coordination of victim identification and victim services through a local task force or multidisciplinary team model.
- Other direct services for victims of crime.



Performance Measures

 Award recipients are required to submit performance measure data in the Performance Measurement Tool (PMT) and separately submit a semi-annual performance report in JustGrants.

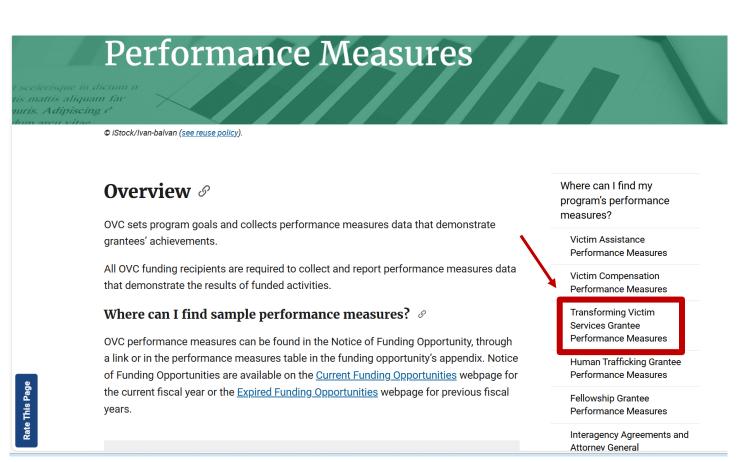

Cost sharing/match is not required for this opportunity.



Budget Detail Form (Calculations and Explanation)



- Use the JustGrants web-based form.
- Costs should be clear with detailed calculations.
- Personnel costs should relate to the key project personnel.
- The budget should include funding to fully implement the project, broken out by year, reflecting 36 months.
- The budget should be mathematically sound and correspond with information described in the Proposal Narrative and aligned with the project design.
- If needed, include additional narrative to describe cost calculations and connection to project goals and objectives.

Responsiveness Review

To meet the basic minimum requirements to advance to peer review and receive consideration for funding your application MUST:

- Be from an eligible applicant.
- Not exceed the award ceiling.
- Be responsive to the NOFO scope.
- Include:
 - SF-424 (in Grants.gov)
 - Proposal Narrative (in JustGrants)
 - Budget detail form, including budget items, their calculations, and explanations (in JustGrants)



Remember, if you fail to submit <u>ANY</u> of required documents, your application <u>will not</u> be considered for funding!



Merit Review Criteria

Applications that meet the basic minimum requirements will be evaluated for technical merit by peer reviewers based on how the proposed project/program addresses the following criteria:

- Statement of the Problem/Description of the Issue (5%): What critical issue or problem the applicant is proposing to address with this project.
- **Project Goals and Objectives (5%):** How the proposed project will address the identified need and the purpose of the funding opportunity.
- **Project Design and Implementation (40%):** The strength of how the applicant will implement activities, including the soundness of the project design and how the activities align to the stated goals and objectives.
- Capabilities and Competencies (40%): The applicant's administrative and technical capacity to successfully complete this project.
- Budget (10%): Completeness and cost effectiveness.

DOJ Grant Application Submission Checklist

Prepare early—any time during the year—to ensure your registration and users are up to date in every system you'll use to apply for DOJ funding. Then, when opportunities post, you will be ready to apply through a two-step process:



- Step 1: Submit the first part of the application in Grants.gov by the specified deadline.
- Step 2: Complete the application in JustGrants by the specified deadline.

The following tips will help you prepare for and complete DOJ grant applications. For additional guidance on the application process, visit the JustGrants Application Submission webpage.

BEFORE YOU BEGIN: SAM.gov Registration

To apply for any federal funding, your organization must have an active registration in the System for Award Management (<u>SAM.gov</u>) and be assigned a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI).

Choose the action that best fits your entity's needs:

- Get Started: New to the system? Sign up for a SAM. gov account, register your entity, and request a UEI.
- Renew Entity: Already signed up? Renew your entity's registration and confirm your UEI and contacts. (Registrations must be renewed each year.)
- Check Entity Status: Unsure whether it's time to renew or if your organization is in the system? Check your status in SAM.gov.

Start the SAM.gov registration process at least 30 days before application deadlines.

An expired or incomplete SAM.gov registration will prevent you from applying for funding.

Tips for Using SAM.gov

- Confirm the email address for your entity's Electronic Business Point-of-Contact (E-Biz POC) in SAM.gov. For first time applicants, the E-Biz POC will add users and validate information in Grants.gov and JustGrants.
- Use an <u>IRS Employer Identification Number</u> (EIN)—not a Social Security Number—when registering in SAM.gov.
- Individual entities (e.g., Fellows) are exempt from SAM.gov registration.

Open the application and use the **Continue** button on the bottom right to navigate. File attachments associated with a section are displayed in the section.

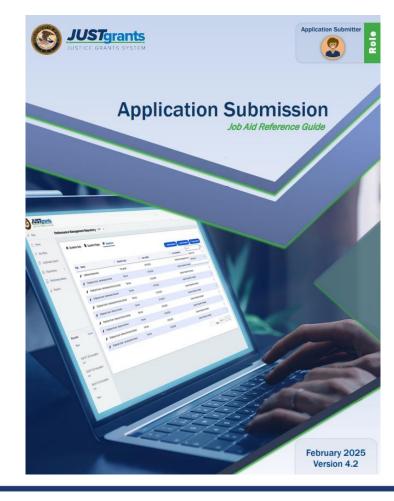

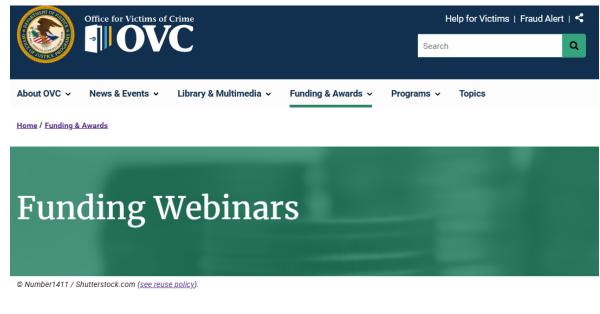
