While some law enforcement jurisdictions have made positive changes, many jurisdictions are still reticent to inform victims of their constitutional rights to receive information on crime victims compensation. Victims and claimants often change contact information and fail to update their information. An increasing trend is for the victim or claimant to submit a good claim, but fail to follow through with providing required information.
5. **Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.**
The compensation program coordinates with the victims' specialist with the Federal Bureau of Investigation to serve victims of federal crimes. The Veteran's Administration has been contracted and presentations have been made to provide them with information for their constituents.

The compensation program provided personal service to many homicide survivors. The commission provided hands -on assistance to secure needed information for surviving family members. Several administrative rules were adopted to increase services and payments to victims.

VOCA Administrative funds were used to cover expenses for two additional HIV Drugs.

12. **Please provide any additional comments that are helpful to improving the Victim Compensation state and/or federal program.**
It would be beneficial if compensation programs received more funds to increase the 60% reimbursement to 75%. This extra funding would allow compensation programs to increase their spending limits and/ or provide new services to victims. There would be no need to increase the amount that could be used for administrative costs.
