Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. Claim is received and entered into the database; issued a claim number and assigned to an investigator; ACIC (criminal history) and Medicaid eligibility report then ran on the victim or claimant. This process is done within the first 2 days of receipt; Claim is then given to investigator, who within 3 days will acknowledge the claim and request pertinent information from law enforcement and medical providers to determine facts of the incident. A detailed summary will then be given to Board member for approval or denial of claim.

Although VOCA Funds have enabled the Arkansas Crime Victims Reparations Board to continue to provide compensation to eligible victims, the uncertainty of availability of funds is a constant concern for budgeting.

5. Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.

There is no differentiation in serving federal and non-federal victims as long as the eligibility criteria have been met. All efforts are put forth to serve all victims of criminally injurious conduct.

6. Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.

Site and networking visits are done on a monthly basis. Investigators visit various, prosecuting attorneys, victim advocates, law enforcement agencies, medical facilities, etc., in their assigned judicial districts providing material and information about the program. Continuous trainings on the program to these and other statewide audiences concerning the Crime Victims compensation program.

Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.

Due to budget concerns, all VOCA funds are used for compensation.
