1. Please explain any significant change in the number of applications received during the reporting period.

Number of applications during FY18 has decreased by 15% compared to FY17. The decrease is mainly in the number of applications for Assault (domestic and non domestic), which follows the general decrease in Assault crimes in the District of Columbia. There is a sharp increase in the number of homicide crimes during the last 4 months of FY18.

Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. 1) Applications received in the mail or filed in-person - Quick review of applications and supporting documents for eligibility (by duty Claims Examiner) - Eligible applications recorded in computer system by Administrative Assistant, file jackets prepared and assigned to Claims Examiners. 2) Claims Examiners review applications filed - request additional information.documents if needed - submit claims and eligible benefits to Board Members (Director and Program Accountant) for approval 3) Board Members review daily payments requested for decision - non approved claims/ payments are returned to Claims Examiners for additional information/clarification - approved payments are submitted electronically by daily batches to the Budget&Finance staff for checks preparation and mailing to vendors/payees.

Please describe any emerging/major issues or notable trends that were encountered in your state that had an impact on your program's ability to meet the needs of crime victims during the reporting period.

The District of Columbia has an ongoing issue of insufficient shelters for homeless residents. Many of our victims were victimised while living on streets.

5. Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.

Regular contacts with USAO which prosecutes federal crimes. Legible crimes per our Statutes do not include many federal crimes (human trafficking, child pornography, financial crimes...). Our Program assists victims of one city (District of Columbia) instead of a whole state - Thus most of service providers (hospitals, funeral homes, ...) do well know benefits of our Program. Our staff attend regular meetings with Victims Services Organisations (SAFE Program, Asian Pacific Legal Resources, Victims Recovery Network...) and City Agencies (DHS, Housing Authority...) to coordinate services to victims.
