Georgia's CVCP has experienced a 49% increase in forensic interview applications from State Fiscal Year 2016, and a 14% increase in forensic medical exam applications.

Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. Georgia has a centralized system for the administration of crime victim compensation program applications, which includes processing of applications and disbursement of compensation funds. The Georgia Crime Victims Compensation Program's responsibilities include 1) document processing – scanning in mailed applications; 2) intake – entering in scanned applications into the claims management system and checking applications submitted through the portal for accuracy; 3) verification – verifying bills with the vendor; and 4) claims investigation - reviewing the claim against federal and state requirements, and eligibility. In addition, customer service staff and advocates work directly with victims to ensure they are able to obtain the documents they need for a complete application.

When we have a Federal case, we work directly with the FBI advocate/liaison to get the information needed in a letter format which answers the critical questions needed for us to move forward with processing the claim.

Georgia CVCP is in the last stages of implementing the new claims management system. The system has undergone some changes and expansions to streamline processes. That, in addition to the launching of the Victims Compensation Portal last year, have been essential to facilitate timely processing of compensation claims.
7. **Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.**
VOCA funds continue to assist the State of Georgia in providing direct benefits to victims and witnesses of violent crimes, as well as their families. In addition to benefits, our VOCA funds help us to sustain our Training and Outreach Coordinator, who continues to provide much needed training to those who directly serve victims (i.e., advocates, medical providers, etc.). These trainings help to increase their knowledge of the Program, as well as, training on the new Portal. In addition, the remaining administrative funds are utilized to support our Intake and Verification Specialists.
