Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. When an application is received, the Commission staff input the data into the system and create a physical file. If medical records and/or billing needs to be requested, it is done at this time. Then police reports are subpoenaed and upon receipt, the case is assigned to an investigator. The investigator reviews the case and, if any follow up for medical, lost earnings or funeral expenses or other issues are needed, they are done at this time. The investigator also issues a decision and order to pay the victim an acknowledgement award and any expenses than can be paid at that time with the case left open to pay further expenses. If there are no further expenses, the claim is closed.

4. **Please describe any emerging/major issues or notable trends that were encountered in your state that had an impact on your program's ability to meet the needs of crime victims during the reporting period.**
The Commission suffered a period of several months with critical staff vacancies that impeded the Commission's ability to process claims.

The victim advocates in the State of Hawaii meet on a quarterly basis. The Commission attends these meetings which are attended by the advocates from the FBI and the US Attorney's Office. Having this relationship with the federal advocates makes it easy to work with them to assist federal crime victims.

VOCA administrative funds were not used during the reporting period.

The Commission attends the quarterly victim advocate meetings and works with victim assistance representatives from the counties prosecutors' offices, the FBI and US Attorney's Office, and military victim assistance representatives. The Commission also leads JRI victim assistance and restitution meetings attended by representatives from the police and the courts. The Commission also took the lead in coordinating statewide Mass Violence Training for responders with an emphasis on victim services. Additionally, the Commission serves on the state VOCA advisory board to determine the prioritization of the spending of VOCA funds and is on the VOCA panel to provide guidance for the establishment of a State Victim Assistance Academy.
