Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. When a violent crime application is received. Within 2 business day an acknowledgement letter is mailed to the victim/claimant giving them 30 days to respond with information as to what type of compensation is being requested and the supporting information such as medical bills. If the application is incomplete, the letter gives them 30 days to respond with the missing information. Also the law enforcement information is sent within two days to the law enforcement agency listed on the application. Once law enforcement information is received and victim is eligible, the bills received can be verified and approved for payment. If the information received indicates the case was referred to the prosecutor's office, a request for information is sent to them as well. Once the prosecutor's information is received, and is favorable, the bills are verified and the claim is submitted for approval. If the law enforcement information indicates illegal activity or contributory misconduct by the victim or if the information was not returned by the timeframe given from the victim/claimant, the claim is denied. The victim has 30 days to request an appeal to our decision in writing. If request for appeal is received, the claim may be reopened to continue processing or a hearing is scheduled. All appeals are heard before an Administrative Law Judge. After they issue their ruling, the victim/claimant can appeal that decision to our Executive Director. The Executive Director's decision is final.
