A form is then sent to the investigating law enforcement agency to verify the crime. Claims specialists review the application and the law enforcement form to make an initial eligibility decision. If all of the eligibility requirements are met, the file is forwarded to other staff to gather billing forms from providers listed on the application, an employment form, funeral billing form, and other documentation of losses listed on the application. The claims specialists then review all of the information received, and determine the amounts to be paid to the applicant and/or the providers. Another staff person prepares a payment order, and explanation of benefits forms to send to the applicant and providers. If the claim clearly does not meet eligibility requirements or there are no expenses to pay, the staff deny or close the claim. If there is some question about the applicant's eligibility under the program's statutes and rules regarding certain requirements, the claim may be forwarded to the 5-member Reparations Board for review. The board votes on the eligibility of claims forwarded to them by staff, and they may vote to pay in full, reduce the claim, or deny the claim. There is an appeals process for applicants who are dissatisfied with a staff or Board decision on a claim.

4. **Please describe any emerging/major issues or notable trends that were encountered in your state that had an impact on your program's ability to meet the needs of crime victims during the reporting period.**
During this reporting period, there was a small increase in expenditures. In particular, expenses for homicides and vehicular crimes increased. As a result, the program will maintain the same rates of coverage for fiscal year 2019, rather than increasing any of its rates. A notable trend is the continued epidemic of fatal opiate overdoses. This has an impact on the reparations program which covers a portion of the costs related to a fatal overdose if the case was charged as a homicide. Several claims were received during the past year for this type of crime.
5. **Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.**
The program continued working closely with the FBI's victim specialists in Minneapolis and Bemidji to serve victims of federal crimes during this reporting period. Reparations staff responded to questions from FBI specialists about reparations policies and procedures. This collaborative effort helped ensure the best services for victims of federal crimes.
6. **Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.**
The program reviewed staffing needs to ensure the timely processing of an increased volume of claims. Two new staff positions (one claims specialist and one support staff) were created and filled. Other new activities to improve our process included updating email contacts for providers to facilitate access to billing information.
7. **Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.**
The VOCA administrative funds are dedicated to the support of one clerical position with the reparations program. The person in this position sets up new reparations claims, assists walk-in applicants, answers phone inquiries from applicants and service providers, and sends an initial letter to the applicant as well as a law enforcement form to the investigating agency. This position helps the program process claims in a timely manner.
8. **Were there any laws, initiatives, or policy changes in your state regarding victim compensation during the reporting period? If yes, please briefly describe them and their impact.**
There were no new laws, initiatives or policy changes regarding victim compensation during this reporting period.

9. **Please describe system-coordination efforts with prosecutors, law enforcement, courts, U.S. attorneys' offices, tribal systems, State VOCA Victim Assistance Coordinator, or other key personnel within the criminal justice system in your state to reduce barriers to victims who may apply to receive victim compensation.**

System-coordination efforts included participating in three regional trainings along with the Crime Victim Justice Unit director. These trainings were attended by 184 advocates and criminal justice professionals from around the state. The trainings covered victims' rights, reparations and other victim services issues. The reparations training provided participants with informational resources they can utilize in serving victims. Many attendees indicated that the information would help them serve victims more effectively by connecting them to funds to assist them with their losses. Additional reparations trainings were provided at other venues as well, including the 2017 Minnesota Victim Assistance Academy, and the first ever Minnesota Corrections Victims Academy. The Corrections Academy was a collaborative effort with the MN Department of Corrections and was attended by 63 corrections facility, field services and central office staff.

10. **Please explain any public outreach efforts to improve awareness of your program.**

During National Crime Victims' Rights Week, the program provided reparations information to the Minnesota Department of Public Safety, Office of Communications for posting on its website, Facebook site, and Twitter. Also, an article about reparations, entitled Legal Learning: Reparations for Victims was featured in the Lake County News Chronicle.

11. **Please list any other outcome measure(s) that are reported to the governor, legislature, or other state entity that have not been reported in this submission. Provide the actual measure(s). The data may be reported separately in your progress report.**

Another outcome measure that is reported to the governor and legislature is the amount of restitution collected annually from violent offenders who were responsible for crimes committed against victims who received reparations. During state fiscal year 2017, the program recovered \$579,000 from those offenders.
