The North Carolina compensation program processes claims in the order received and date stamped upon intake. The process involves: Intake - claim entered into VC data base; Distribution - when all needed material are in file the claim is distributed for investigation, if additional materials are needed the claim is distributed for information request; Investigation - claim submitted for investigation to determine eligibility; Recommendation - award-claim is transferred to examination, denial-claim is transferred to Director / Commission; Examination - expenses are reviewed for payment or denial, award-claim is transferred to Director / Commission, denial-claim is transferred to Director / Commission; Determination - Director / Commission determines award or denial, award-claim is submitted to fiscal for payment, letter of determination to victim/claimant, denial-letter of determination to victim/claimant.

Presentations and informational materials are provided to the FBI, tribal communities and military communities along with other outreach efforts throughout the state in collaboration with other federal agencies.

Training and material provided to external agencies such as DA's offices, Law Enforcement and other victim service agencies; which allowed these agencies to provide victims/claimants with compensation referral information.

VOCA Administrative Funds supports 2 1/2 positions which are critical to servicing victims. Without the Admin supported positions we could not provide timely or quality service to victims. The VOCA Administrative Funds also provided promotional materials and compensation staff training.
