North Dakota Crime Victim Compensation Programs tries to ensure claims to be processed within 45 working days, and no later than 60 days, from receipt of a completed application to the final decision. • How long does it take to cut a check for a VOCA claim? Local CVC programs disburse CVC funds on a monthly basis, generally after a regularly scheduled claim review meeting. The Colorado State Standards for the Administration of Crime Victim Compensation Programs requires the Judicial District Administrator to issue payments on a victim compensation claim within ten working days of receipt of the signed payment authorizations submitted by a CVC Board.
