Upon receipt of the application, we contact the victim/claimant to acknowledge receipt, obtain any additional information we may need, determine safest way to send correspondence, and explain next steps. We then request the relevant police reports, and victim's State criminal record. Once we receive, the claim is submitted for a decision. Once the decision is made, we send a letter with the decision, and next steps via regular and certified mail, or email if this is the preferred contact method.

We have strong partnerships in the private sector with many victim service agencies, as well as most police departments within the state, and the attorney general's office. We are in constant communication with them and both attend and host training sessions to learn more about what they do, and so they can learn more about our program to help them feel more empowered with their victims to navigate the process. We also take on most of the burden of document gathering ourselves to make the process as seamless as possible for victims
