Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. 1) Applications and supporting documentation received in mail or filed in-person. "Duty Claims Examiner" review quickly applications/documents for eligibility. 2) Administrative Assistant records applications and documentations in computer system. She prepares file jackets and claims are assigned to Claims Examiners. 3) Claims Examiners review claims and documents and request additional information - if needed. Claims and payment requests are then prepared and submitted for approval. 4) Program Director and/or Program Accountant review claims and payment requests submitted . Eligible payment requests are submitted to the Budget&Finance staff. 5) Budget&Finance staff prepare and mail out payments to vendirs/payees.

Please describe any emerging/major issues or notable trends that were encountered in your state that had an impact on your program's ability to meet the needs of crime victims during the reporting period.

The District of Columbia has an ongoing issue of insufficient shelters for homeless residents.. Many of our victims are victimised while living on streets.
