She prepares file jackets and claims are assigned to Claims Examiners. 3) Claims Examiners review claims and documents and request additional information - if needed. Claims and payment requests are then prepared and submitted for approval. 4) Program Director and/or Program Accountant review claims and payment requests submitted . Eligible payment requests are submitted to the Budget&Finance staff. 5) Budget&Finance staff prepare and mail out payments to vendors/payees.

The District of Columbia has an ongoing issue of insufficient shelters for homeless residents.. Many of our victims are victimised while living on streets.

Regular contacts with USAO which prosecutes federal crimes. Many federal crimes are not included in our Program eligible crimes. (e.g. human trafficking, financial crimes...). Our Program may use related crimes to assist victims of federal crimes (e.g. sexual assault for victims of human trafficking, child abuse for victims of child pornography...)

Improve communication and collaboration with City Governmental Agencies and various Victims Services Organisations to coordinate assistance to victims.

VOCA administrative funds have assisted with the salary of one Claims Examiner and one Assistant Claims Examiner. These two additional staff are needed to expedite the processing of claims and payments.

Revival of the Advisory Board that holds monthly meetings to review possible outdated statutes and rules.

Our Program assists victims of one city (District of Columbia) instead of a whole larger state. Thus most of services providers (e.g. hospitals, funeral homes..) are well aware of benefits provided by our Program. We also have regular contacts with various Victims Organisations (e.g. SAFE Program, Network for Victims Recovery, AYUDA...) to coordinate assistance to victims.
