VOCA Administrative funds are used to supplement staff payroll, which allows us to use the funds that would've been spent on payroll to instead apply that to victim payments.

AB 534 moved the program from the Department of Administration to the Department of Health and Human Services, effective July 1st. Other changes in this statute include extending our application period from 1 year to 2 years, and changing our statute on contributory conduct. We are undergoing a period of transition and trying to adjust to the changes.
