Who is Unified Solutions?

Unified Solutions is a 501(c)(3) Tribal non-profit with a mission to provide training, technical assistance, and human services in American Indian/Alaska Native communities. In doing so we advance justice, advocate for victims of crime, and ensure strategies that address challenges experienced by culturally diverse individuals, communities, and organizations. In 2002, Unified Solutions applied for, and was awarded, an Office for Victims of Crime (OVC) award to provide Training and Technical Assistance (TTA) to OVC Tribal grantees.

What Type of Training and Technical Assistance Does Unified Solutions Provide?

Our Training and Technical Assistance (TTA) services are victim-centered, trauma-informed, and support the preservation of Tribal sovereignty. The following are some of the areas in which Unified Solutions provides TTA:

Skills Training

On-site training workshops, regional seminars, conferences, and virtual classes.

Needs Assessments

Comprehensive assessments administered in-person, over the telephone, or as written interviews, depending on the needs of the Tribal community.

Capacity Building

Grassroots leadership and program management courses, facilitated community conversations, and coordinated agency responses along with mentoring programs designed to help build leadership principles.

Strategic Planning

Developing goals, objectives, and actionable plans for your program and community.

Sustainability Development

Budgeting for program development, grant-writing workshops, maximizing human, fiscal, and community resources.

Program Evaluation

Data collection and interpretation, establishing feedback loops throughout your organization.

Coaching and Consulting

One-on-one personal contact for technical support and greater effectiveness. Techniques for improved group dynamics in the workplace. Support for program managers.

Community of Practice

Unified's Community of Practice Virtual Gatherings are monthly, interactive web-based training and networking opportunities that highlight best practices from OVC funded Tribal Grantee Programs and subject matter experts.

Is There a Cost to Grantees for Training and Technical Assistance from Unified Solutions?

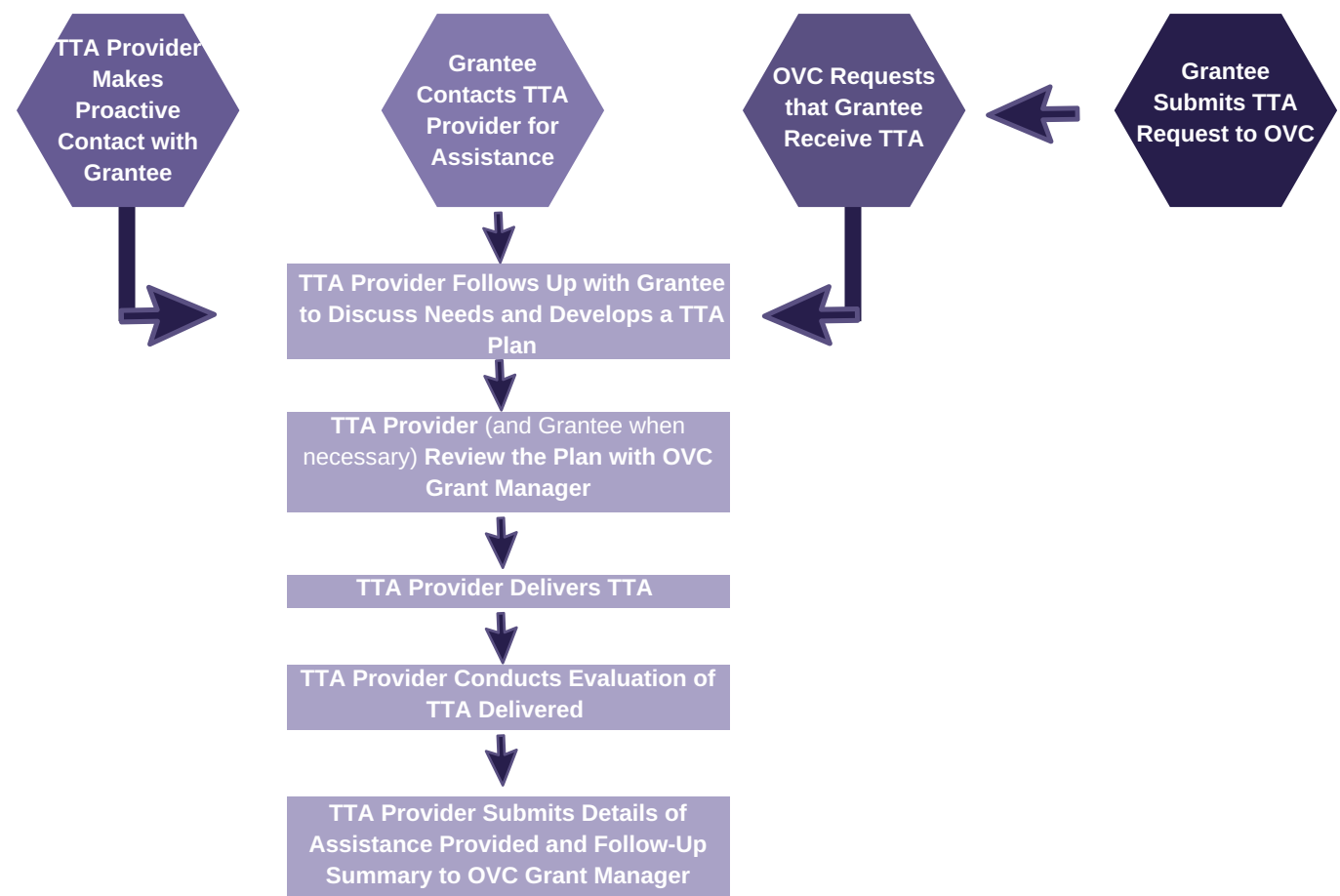

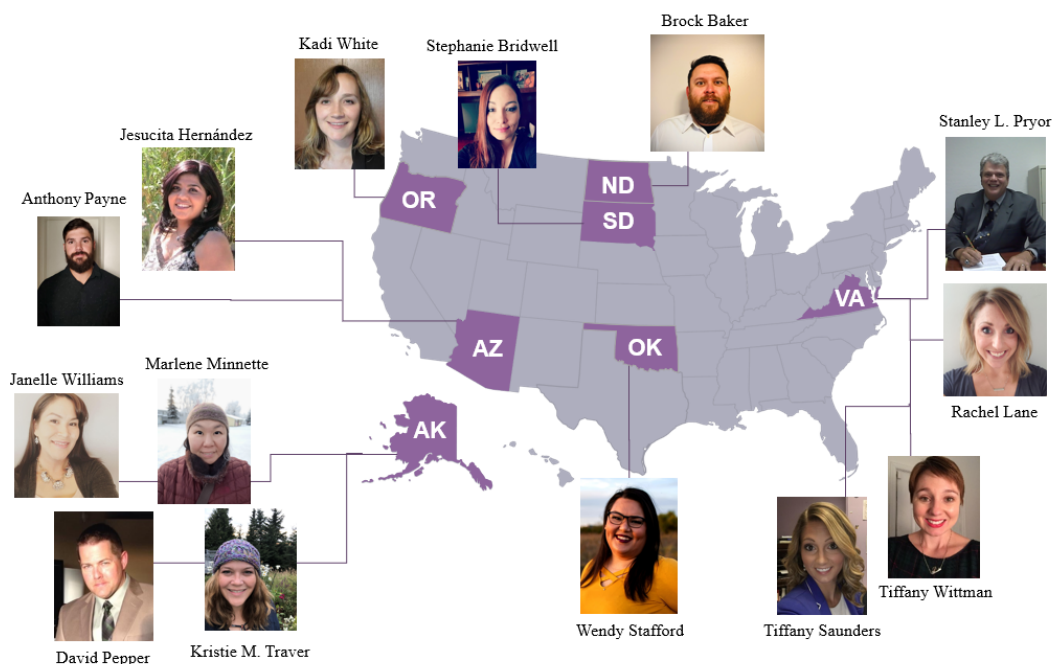
