1. **Please explain any significant change in the number of applications received during the reporting period.**
The number of claims applications received during this reporting period is down from previous years. While we have noticed a slow but steady decline in recent years, there was significant drop off from March through September due to Covid-19.
2. **The average length of time to process an application for claim eligibility for compensation**
Count days from time of receipt of application to decision. 98

Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. Upon receipt of a claim application, either electronically through the Victim Service Portal or paper, the claim is assigned to a Crime Victim Specialist. The Specialist will request documentation to establish eligibility and render a decision. Some expenses could be paid in the original decision. If additional documentation is needed for medical expenses, the claim will be referred to the Additional Medical Unit where staff will then reach out for additional information and process any further medical expenses that arrive in the future.

4. **Please describe any emerging/major issues or notable trends that were encountered in your state that had an impact on your program's ability to meet the needs of crime victims during the reporting period.**
The emergence of Covid-19 shut down the state of New York on March 16, 2020. Initially, OVS scrambled to get staff up and running remotely to perform their duties. There were numerous challenges for staff to telecommute 100% at a moment's notice but after a few weeks, we were able to account for all of our processes and remove any barriers we initially had for processing claims.
5. **Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.**
OVS continues to work with the FBI and neighboring states to prepare for mass casualty events. OVS staff has also begun to partner with municipalities within the state to prepare for any events that OVS can assist with on a county or more regional level.
6. **Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.**
As referenced in question 4, Covid -19 presented OVS with some claim processing issues. OVS generally does not begin to investigate a claim until we have a signed authorization form from the claimant. 80% of our claims are submitted through our funded victim assistance programs. Since they were all also working remotely, they were not meeting clients in person to have them sign the form and upload it to the claims. OVS then began assigning claims to be investigated without this authorization form and included it in the duties of the Crime Victim Specialist's list of documents to get from the claimant. This removed the initial delay in processing that was an unexpected issue with Covid-19.
7. **Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.**
The VOCA administrative funds support a number of OVS staff dedicated to the processing of claims. In the absence of these funds, there would be insufficient staff to process claims in a timely manner or provide quality services to crime victims and their families.
8. **Were there any laws, initiatives, or policy changes in your state regarding victim compensation during the reporting period? If yes, please briefly describe them and their impact.**
Effective 6/15/20, the forensic examination reimbursement fee changed to the amount of itemized charges, to be reimbursed at the Medicaid rate and which cumulatively shall not exceed the following, tiered reimbursements: Tier 1 - \$800 for an exam of a sexual assault survivor where no Sexual Offense Evidence Collection Kit is used; Tier 2 - \$1,200 for an exam of a sexual assault survivor where a Sexual Offense Evidence Collection Kit is used; Tier 3 - \$1,500 for an exam of a sexual assault survivor who is eighteen years of age or older, with or without the use of a Sexual Offense Evidence Collection Kit, and with the provision of an initial 7-day supply (starter pack) of HIV post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP); and Tier 4 - \$2,500 for an exam of a sexual assault survivor who is less than eighteen years of age, with or without the use of a Sexual Offense Evidence Collection Kit, and with the provision of the full regimen of HIV PEP.
9. **Please describe system-coordination efforts with prosecutors, law enforcement, courts, U.S. attorneys' offices, tribal systems, State VOCA Victim Assistance Coordinator, or other key personnel within the criminal justice system in your state to reduce barriers to victims who may apply to receive victim compensation.**
OVS Compensation staff continued their training sessions with funded victim assistance programs to ensure advocates understand the benefits available to victims as well as the legal limitations that also exist.

10. **Please explain any public outreach efforts to improve awareness of your program.**

OVS staff attended various community events and manned information tables at several conferences throughout the state over the past year. OVS staff regularly participate in the Got Your Back backpack program sponsored by SUNY. This program puts together backpacks containing necessities and items of comfort for sexual assault victims.

11. **Please list any other outcome measure(s) that are reported to the governor, legislature, or other state entity that have not been reported in this submission. Provide the actual measure(s). The data may be reported separately in your progress report.**

OVS reports to the NYS Governor's Office on how it is meeting the requirements for the State's mandated Language Access Program. OVS staff contacts with LEP individuals and spending for translation and interpretation services are reported annually.

12. **Please provide any additional comments that are helpful to improving the Victim Compensation state and/or federal program.**

OVS would support an increase in the OCA compensation award perhaps by increasing the percentage of reimbursement of state payouts to 75% from 60% or to reimburse for all payouts to crime victims regardless of funding source.
