NARRATIVE QUESTIONS

1. **Please explain any significant change in the number of applications received during the reporting period.**
There were 3,322 applications filed in this federal fiscal year and 3,222 in the last fiscal year. Accordingly, there was not a significant change in the number of applications received.
2. **The average length of time to process an application for claim eligibility for compensation**

Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. Explain the responsibilities of your office in processing a claim: The Illinois Crime Victims Compensation Act (CVCA) statute, 740 ILCS 45/1 et. seq., requires the Illinois Attorney General's Office to investigate claims and for the Illinois Court of Claims to approve or deny CVCA claims and conduct hearings on appeals. The Court of Claims administers the fiscal aspects of the CVCA program. Applications are received in the Illinois Attorney General's Office then filed with the Clerk of the Court of Claims. The Illinois Attorney General's Office then sends the claim to an "eligibility" claims analyst to review whether it meets all statutory requirements. If the requirements are met, the claim then goes to a "processing" claims analyst to substantiate expenses related to the victimization. The Illinois Attorney General's Office then submits an Investigatory Report to the Illinois Court of Claims in a "closing" which occurs two times per month. When the Judges meet they they enter orders which determine whether a claim is awarded, denied, or an award no pay. An "award no pay" means a claimant is eligible but collateral sources have already paid the expenses or they have not yet incurred any eligible expenses of the victimization. Claimants have 30 days after entry of the Court's Order to appeal. If a Claimant appeals a Court Order, the case is set for hearing before a Court of Claims Commissioner who then submits a recommendation to the Judge assigned to the case. The assigned Judge reviews court transcripts, caselaw, statutory law, and the Commissioner's recommendation prior to entering a final Order. Note #1: The above process will change January 1, 2022, wherein the Illinois Attorney General's Office will make initial claim determinations and the Court will handle appeals. Note #2: Claim processing times were unusually long due to work modifications caused by Covid-19 and a ransomware attack on the Office of the Illinois Attorney General.

4. **Please describe any emerging/major issues or notable trends that were encountered in your state that had an impact on your program's ability to meet the needs of crime victims during the reporting period.**
Work at home challenges due to Covid-19 and a ransomware attack on the Office of the Illinois Attorney General substantially increased the processing time of Crime Victims Compensation Act claims during this federal fiscal year.
5. **Please describe in detail efforts taken to serve Victims of Federal Crime during the reporting period.**
Federal crime victims are served the same as all other Illinois violent crime victims with timeliness, accuracy, consistency and service with the professional cooperation and assistance of our local FBI Victim Assistance Coordinator.
6. **Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.**

7. **Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.**
VOCA administrative funds assist vital staff to attend national training so the program can stay current on the national trends in providing services to victims of violent crimes. The funds also provide for the salary of a Commissioner in Chicago who is solely dedicated to holding prompt hearings for the victims of violent crimes.
8. **Were there any laws, initiatives, or policy changes in your state regarding victim compensation during the reporting period? If yes, please briefly describe them and their impact.**
The Illinois Crime Victims Compensation Act, 740 ILCS 45/1 et. seq, has been amended effective January 1, 2022. The following is some of the highlights of the amendments. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General will make initial claim determinations. The maximum for funeral and burial expenses will increase from \$7,500 to \$10,000. The maximum for loss of wages and support per month will increase from \$1,250 to \$2,400. The maximum per claim increases from \$27,000 to \$45,000 on August 7, 2022. The time limit to file a claim will increase from two year to five years.
9. **Please describe system-coordination efforts with prosecutors, law enforcement, courts, U.S. attorneys' offices, tribal systems, State VOCA Victim Assistance Coordinator, or other key personnel within the criminal justice system in your state to reduce barriers to victims who may apply to receive victim compensation.**
The Illinois Attorney General's Office has a crime victim assistance hotline and agency website that assists victims of violent crimes by directing them to the appropriate victim services and answering any questions they may have concerning applying for financial assistance through the crime victims compensation program.

10. **Please explain any public outreach efforts to improve awareness of your program.**

Pursuant to 725 ILCS 1420/4, all law enforcement in the State of Illinois are required to give each victim of a violent crime a written statement and explanation of rights form which was prepared by the Office of the Illinois Attorney General and includes information on how to apply for financial assistance under the Crime Victims Compensation Act. Pursuant to 740 ILCS 45/5.1, every hospital in the State of Illinois must prominently display in their emergency room posters giving notification of the existence and general provisions of the Crime Victims Compensation Act. In addition, the Secretary of State/Illinois Court of Claims and Illinois Attorney General's websites provide the general public with information on the Crime Victims Compensation Act.
