1. **Please explain any significant change in the number of applications received during the reporting period.**  
We received more applications this year than we ever have. This is partly due to our efforts to educate victim advocates and other stakeholders. The other part is most likely due to how accessible our online application is. Victims can access the application from any smart phone, tablet, or computer.
2. **The average length of time to process an application for claim eligibility for compensation**

Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. The largest majority of our applications are received through our online application system. Once received, the application is reviewed to ensure it's complete. We then request LE information. Once the LE information is returned a final check on the application is completed by admin staff. The application is then routed to the Program Manager for review and approval/denial. Depending on the circumstances in the application, it's possible additional information may be needed prior to a decision being made.

We have an excellent working relationship with our Federal victim witness advocates. They are included in our communications and we have regular contact with them regarding status on claims or cases.

We have continued to make improvements with our online application system. We have adjusted business practices to ensure we are efficient as we can be, while also cognizant of the needs of the victims.

North Dakota did not use any administrative funds from our grant.

There were no major changes to laws, initiatives, or policies. However, we are very early in the process to make some revisions to our administrative rules.

I completed a program presentation to a group of states attorneys during the second quarter. I believe this has helped as prior to the training I've heard a few instances where the states attorney never mentioned the program until sentencing, which was more than 1 year after the incident. We continue to focus our efforts on training victim advocates to ensure they can properly advise victims.

We are currently developing a brochure for victim service providers and others to provide victims. We do not currently have a brochure or other publication. We are also working to find avenues to train various agencies and personnel working with victims.
