Once an application for compensation is received by the department it is assigned a claim number. The claims specialist requests documentation from law enforcement, DHS and assessment centers. Once documents are received the claim is forwarded to a Claims Examiner for review. At that time the information is reviewed in order to determine if the request for compensation meets the statutory eligibility criteria for approval. Then an approval order is order i sent to the claimant. If the request is denied the examiner will draft a notice of denial. Once a claim is accepted any bills in the file will be reviewed for payment.

The Program has had an exceptional working relationship with the Oregon FBI victim specialists and the Oregon US Attorney's Office for several years. If the compensation program receives an application that indicates a federal crime CVSSD staff will contact eh victim advocates at the US attorney's office or the FBI in order to obtain information regarding the criminal case.

The Oregon Crime Victims' Compensation Program continually improves the online CVC portal to allow victims to submit applications online.

The Oregon program uses administrative funds to send new staff to victim assistance trainings through the State Victim Assistance Academy. Staff are also sent to a yearly diversity conference as well as the Child Abuse Summit. These trainings expand staff knowledge of victimization, trauma informed victim services and victim advocacy.
