Overview of Application/Claims Processing Steps to Processing Applications: Step 1: Date stamp application. Step 2: Review application for completeness of information. Step 3: Enter claimant/applicant data in Excel Spreadsheet. Step 4: Assign claim number. Step 5: Generate letter of receipt to applicant, if not done in person. Step 6: Generate letter requesting missing support documents, if not done in person. Step 7: Generate follow-up letter for missing support documents, if not received, and if done in person. Step 8: Review application and supporting documents for consideration of eligibility. Step 9: Calculate eligible/quantifiable expenses (economic losses/costs, medical expenses). Step 10: Prepare and submit, to Executive Secretary summary of claim, recommendation of action to be taken. Step 11: Provide final recommendation to Commission for review and consideration. Step 13: Commission meets to make assessment and make a final determination of claims. Step 14: Create letter advising Applicant of Commissions decision. Step 15: Submit supporting documents to Finance requesting Applicants Vendor ID, followed by request for a check. Step 16 Photocopy checks, record check data on Criminal Victims Case Tracker Step 16: Mail checks via Certified Mail to Applicant/Payees or arrange for check pickup. Step 17: Mark claim closed; date check received by applicant.
