Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. Once an application is entered into our system, 2 requests are mailed. One to the law enforcement agency listed on the application and the second letter mailed to the victim/claimant giving them 30 days to submit medical or funeral bills. Once law enforcement responds we check to see if the case was sent to the prosecutor's office. If so, a request is mailed to the prosecutor's office. Once all information from the crime is received a determination is mailed. If we will pay we check for the bills requested. If none submitted, we deny the claim. If bills from the crime are submitted, the analyst will verify each bill to be paid by calling the provider. Once this step is completed, the claim is submitted to the supervisor for review and approval. All victims that have their claims denied have a right to file an appeal. The claim may then be forwarded to an Administrative Law Judge for a hearing.
