Please explain your state's procedure for processing an application for claim eligibility, from time of receipt of application to decision. The North Carolina Crime Victim Compensation Program processes claims in the order received and date stamped upon intake. The process involves: Intake - claim entered VC case management data base and an open letter is mailed to the victim/claimant; Distribution - when all needed material is in file, the claim is distributed for investigation, if additional materials are needed, the claim is distributed for information request; Investigation - claim submitted for investigation to determine eligibility; Recommendation - award- claim is transferred to financial examination, denial-claim is transferred to Director / Commission; Examination - expenses are reviewed for payment or denial, award-claim is transferred to Director / Commission, denial-claim is transferred to Director / Commission; Determination - Director / Commission determines award or denial, award-claim is submitted to fiscal for payment, letter of determination to victim/claimant, denial-letter of determination to victim/claimant.

The program maintains relationships with federal victim coordinators and provides support to victims referred to the compensation program. Education materials are provided to agencies that have direct victim contact (courts, law enforcement, and victim service agencies)

Please describe any notable activities during the reporting period that improved the process of victim compensation services.

Office Victim Compensation Services provided webinars in English and Spanish to educate the public of the application process for Crime Victim Compensation. The webinars "How to Apply for Victim Compensation" reached the general public, victims of violent crime and their families, law enforcement agencies, social services, health care providers, other government agencies and community organizations who have direct victim contact.

Please describe in detail ways in which your state used VOCA Administrative funds and the impact of these funds on the state's ability to improve victim compensation services during the reporting period.

VOCA Administrative funds support administrative positions that provide assistance to victims/claimants by providing information to them regarding completion of claims applications. Additionally, these positions assist victims with gathering documentation needed for claim processing. The administrative positions provide status updates to victims and their families.

8. Were there any laws, initiatives, or policy changes in your state regarding victim compensation during the reporting period? If yes, please briefly describe them and their impact.

There were no laws, initiatives, or policy changes in North Carolina regarding victim compensation during the reporting period.

9. Please describe system-coordination efforts with prosecutors, law enforcement, courts, U.S. attorneys' offices, tribal systems, State VOCA Victim Assistance Coordinator, or other key personnel within the criminal justice system in your state to reduce barriers to victims who may apply to receive victim compensation.

The Victim Compensation Commission works in collaboration with these agencies to aid in determining claim eligibility, compensation claim investigators contact the appropriate official to gather information used to make recommendation to award/deny based on the circumstances of a crime incident. The program provides training to court personnel and criminal justice agencies regarding the compensation program. This allows these agencies to provide compensation information to victims and their families about how to apply to the program or contact this agency.

10. Please explain any public outreach efforts to improve awareness of your program.

The victim compensation program continues to engage in an awareness campaign which utilizes several media platforms. Reaching statewide underserved and rural communities providing education and contact information is a major focus. Through the use of various platforms such as print media, digital display, grassroots community involvement, TV and Radio, the campaign was able to provide information to a wide audience.
