Once we receive the application, we contact the victim/claimant to acknowledge receipt, obtain any additional information we may need, determine safest way to send correspondence, and explain next steps. We then request the relevant police reports, and victim's State criminal record from the police department and the attorney General's office. Once we receive these, the claim is submitted for a decision. Once the decision is made, we send the claimant a letter with the decision and next steps.

We have created a community outreach plan that helps us identify agencies and community-based organizations that we have not partnered with. It also helps us keep track of the frequency and type of outreach that we are doing.

We used VOCA Administrative funds to assist with training, conferences, and operations costs. Our program has a very limited budget for expenses other than claim payouts, so this helps us make sure that our staff is trained in all the most recent information necessary to best serve our victims.

8. Were there any laws, initiatives, or policy changes in your state regarding victim compensation during the reporting period? If yes, please briefly describe them and their impact.

We have begun the process of changing the amounts we have stipulated in our in our rules and regulations to better reflect the current costs of emergency relocation.

We have strong partnerships in the state with many agencies that provide services to victims, as well as the police departments within the state, and the attorney general's office. We are in constant communication with them which facilitates our ability to obtain the information that we need to process claims very quickly. We also attend and host training sessions to ensure we are all equally knowledgeable of what we do and any changes that occur. We also take on most of the burden of document gathering ourselves to make the process as seamless as possible for victims.

We have created a community outreach plan that helps us identify agencies and community-based organizations that we have not partnered with. It also helps us keep track of the frequency and type of outreach that we are doing. During this period our administrator has gone on three radio stations to provide program information as well as to answer questions from the community.
